# Hooghly Mohsin College: A Journey Through Time

## Glorious Genesis

Situated at the heart of the serene town of Chinsurah, overlooking the picturesque western bank of the River Hooghly, Hooghly Mohsin College—established in 1836—stands as one of the oldest and most prestigious institutions in the district and the State. The college owes its foundation to the remarkable philanthropy of Haji Mohammad Mohsin, a wealthy merchant and humanitarian, who dedicated his vast estate for social welfare and educational development. After his demise, the mismanagement of his endowment by successors prompted administrative intervention. By then, Chinsurah had transitioned from Dutch to British authority (1825), enabling the London Missionary Society to envision major educational reforms across the region. Although such initiatives were aligned with colonial objectives of generating an English-educated administrative workforce, they simultaneously opened new horizons for higher learning among Indians. A committee chaired by T.B. Macaulay, with leading members such as Edward Ryan, Radhakanta Deb, and Rasamay Dutta, was constituted to frame a plan for utilizing Mohsin's fund. Rejecting the idea of a religious minority institution, the committee proposed a secular college. Amid debates and reservations from sections of the Muslim community, "The College of Mohammad Mohsin" was established on 1 August 1836, initially in a rented building owned by Pran Krishna Haldar. Although originally known to the public as "Hooghly College," the institution was formally renamed Hooghly Mohsin College during its Centenary Celebration in 1936. It offered two initial wings—English and Oriental Studies. The college was affiliated to the University of Calcutta on 2 May 1857, began Honours courses in 1864–65, and introduced Law during the same period. After temporary discontinuation in 1907, the Law programme was revived in 1974. Following the establishment of the University of Burdwan in 1960, the college became its constituent institution. Over time, it has expanded into a large multidisciplinary centre offering undergraduate and postgraduate studies in Arts, Science, and Commerce.



## Proud Present

For nearly two centuries, Hooghly Mohsin College has remained steadfast as a beacon of academic excellence, nurturing social, ethical, and cultural values. As a fully State Government-funded institution, it ensures equitable access to quality education, regardless of religion, community, class, or gender. The college embodies a vibrant multicultural and multilingual atmosphere, fostered by a dedicated and highly qualified faculty. Administrative services are centrally digitized, including office management, finance and record processing. The central library, enriched with about 1,14,800 books, is fully committed to ensure efficient access for students and staff. The college currently offers 17 undergraduate and 8 postgraduate programmes. Students may opt for either three-year degree courses or four-year Honours programmes, aligned with the National Education Policy 2020. The Science Departments include Botany, Chemistry, Economics, Geology, Physics, Physiology, Mathematics, and Zoology. Departments within Humanities include Bengali, English, Economics, Hindi, History, Political Science, Philosophy, Sanskrit, and Urdu. A dynamic Department of Commerce offers Accountancy as its specialization. The Departments of Urdu, Physiology, and Geology are recognized research centres to conduct Ph.D programmes. Several faculty members are recognized research supervisors across multiple universities. At present, the college hosts around 3,250 UG students, 248 PG students, and three dozen Ph.D. scholars—of whom two dozen are pursuing their thesis work, half dozen have recently been awarded degree in 2025 and nine have submitted their thesis. Research activity remains strong, with several completed and three ongoing projects funded by national and state agencies such as UGC, ICSSR, DST-SERB and WBDST. To promote scholarly

engagement, the college publishes a biennial, peer-reviewed journal, Academic Journal of Hooghly Mohsin College (ISSN: 0973-6212). The latest special volume, released in 2025, celebrated the scientific achievements of the college's distinguished alumnus, Dr. Upendranath Brahmachari—discoverer of Urea Stibamine, the cure for kala-azar. The college's excellence is consistently reflected in student outcomes: many secure top ranks in university examinations and succeed in national/state competitive tests. The institution ensures academic support through remedial classes, feedback-driven reforms, career guidance, and seminars. The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC), along with various committees, organizes conferences, special lectures, and workshops to cultivate research motivation and social awareness. A landmark National Seminar on U.N. Brahmachari, organized at Chinsurah Rabindra Bhavan, fostered interdisciplinary discussions on public health and history of medicine. Awareness programmes on Intellectual Property Rights, training programmes for faculty, and participation in national academic platforms collectively enrich the academic ecosystem. The college offers subsidized hostel facilities and ensures students benefit from Government scholarships. Through active participation in NCC and NSS, students engage with the community, developing leadership, social commitment, and civic awareness.

### **When Past Meets Present**

The Institution has played a significant role in shaping the intellectual and nationalist awakening during the 19th and 20th centuries. Among its illustrious alumni are eminent litterateurs, nationalists, reformers, scientists, artists, and jurists — including: Bankim Chandra Chattopadhyay, Dwijendralal Roy, Sanjib Chandra Chattopadhyay, Rangalal Bandyopadhyay, Jyotish Chandra Ghosh, Muzaffar Ahmed, Kanailal Dutta, Syed Amir Ali, Dr. Upendranath Brahmachari, J.N. Bhar, Shyamal Mitra, Satinath Mukhopadhyay, etc. Their contributions to literature, science, law, culture, and India's freedom movement form the cornerstone of the college's pride. A registered Alumni Association remains active in academic development, industry networking, and career mentorship—bridging the institution's glorious heritage with its promising future.

### **Fare Forward**

Accredited with a B++ grade (NAAC 2<sup>nd</sup> Cycle, 2022) and recognized by the UGC under 12(B) and 2(f), the college has already been conferred the prestigious status of “College with Potential for Excellence.” The DBT, Government of India, has granted STAR College status, while the DST supported the institution under the DST-FIST scheme, strengthening its scientific infrastructure. With an expanding research culture, innovative teaching methodologies, and a community of highly motivated students and faculty, the College continues to strive toward new benchmarks of academic distinction. Guided by the visionary leadership of Dr. Purushottam Pramanik, Principal, the college remains committed to fulfilling its mission of shaping enlightened, socially responsible global citizens.

## About Our College

Hooghly Mohsin College is presently recognised as an affiliated college of The University of Burdwan. The University has introduced new syllabus of **3-Year Degree / 4-Year Honours** in various subjects under 'Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programme (CCFUP)' as per the **National Education Policy 2020** w.e.f. 2023-2024 for the first time in accordance with the recommendations of the UGC. The Programme offered are now known as **4-Years Honours and 3-Years Degree in B.A., B.Com. and B.Sc. courses in a total of 17 subjects. In the postgraduate section, 2-year M.A, M.Com., M.Sc. courses in CBCS system is offered in this college in 8 subjects such as English, Geology, Botany, Political Science, Zoology, Physiology, Urdu and Commerce.**

Our **Vision** is to cultivate students, belonging to all sections of the society, with best education and instilling values in them to go forth into the world as a good human being. Our **Mission** is to foster the sense of discipline and dedication in addition to the intellectual, moral and cultural development and to equip the students to meet the challenges of the outside world.

Hooghly Mohsin College was accredited with a '**B++**' grade in the second cycle of **NAAC assessment** and accreditation in September 2022. The college boasts remarkable progression of students in higher studies such as IITs, IISER etc. In the recent academic years (2024 and 2025), a total of **20 students** have cleared the **Joint Admission Test for M.Sc. (JAM) examinations with all India ranks** and **4 students** have cleared **UGC-NET Examination**. One of our student from the English Department have secured admission to the **University of Huddersfield, London** for pursuing higher studies.

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) looks after the overall academic development of the college. The college constantly strives towards becoming a potential centre for excellence in future. A number of unique features of this college are narrated here as follows –



- **Public funded institution:** The college, directly governed by the Higher Education Department and the Education Directorate, Government of the West Bengal, offers UG and PG degrees at a **nominal fee structure**.
- **Ragging-free campus:** The **Anti-ragging Cell** of the college ensures zero tolerance to ragging in the college campus and organizes awareness campaigns, the details of which are available in the college website.
- **National Cadet Corps (NCC) and National Service Scheme(NSS):** A student of this college can participate in these two courses.
- **Counselling and Career Guidance and Placement Cell:** A cell to provide career options to the students through industry interaction and campus recruitment.
- **Internal Complaints Committee:** The Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) adopts a policy of zero tolerance against gender discrimination and sexual harassment.

# *UG (CCFUP) Regulation of The University of Burdwan*

## **Regulations relating to UG Courses of Studies and Examinations**

### **Courses of Study**

Undergraduate Degree Programmes of either 3 or 4-year duration, with multiple entry and exit points and re-entry options, with appropriate certifications such as:

- a UG Certificate will be awarded after completing 1 year (2 Semesters) of study in the chosen fields of study, provided such student completes a skill based vocational course of additional 4 credits and decides to quit the program.
- a UG Diploma after 2 years (4 Semesters) of study, provided such student completes a skill based vocational course of additional 4 credits and decides to quit the program.
- a Bachelor's Degree after a 3-year (6 Semesters) programme of study,
- a Bachelor's Degree (Honours) after a 4-year (8 Semesters) programme of study. If the students complete a rigorous research project/ dissertation in their major area(s) of study in the 4th year of a bachelor's degree then (Honours with Research).

The admission to UG Degree Programmes of study, either 3 or 4-year duration, will be governed by the **guidelines of the affiliating University** and the **Higher Education Department of Government of West Bengal** as and when framed.

A Candidate shall be allowed to pursue any one of the Undergraduate Degree Programmes of the University **(not more than one) at a time.**

### **Types of Courses, Distribution of Courses and Credits:**

A semester comprises 90 working days and an academic year is divided into two semesters. A summer term is for eight weeks during summer vacation. Internship/ apprenticeship/ work-based vocational education and training can be carried out during the summer term, especially by students who wish to exit after two semesters or four semesters of study. Regular courses may also be offered during the summer on a fast-track mode to enable students to do additional courses or complete backlogs in coursework. The HEIs can decide on the courses to be offered in the summer term depending on the availability of faculty and the number of students.

**University Regulations Relating To B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. Examinations as per curriculum and credit framework For UG Programmes (CCFUP) and National Education Policy (NEP) 2020**

i. A student (Regular/Back) shall have to complete entire programme of studies within seven (7) consecutive years (in case of 4-Year Hons. Programme)/ six (6) consecutive years (in case of 3-Year Degree Programme) including his/her original year of enrolment in Sem.-I Examination subject to the condition that not more than three (3) consecutive chances shall be allowed in each Semester.

If any of the chance(s), mentioned above, is not availed of by a candidate within the stipulated period, the chance(s) shall be deemed to have lapsed.

ii. If a student intends to exit the programme at the end of the 1st year after securing 40 credits, such student will be awarded "UG Certificate", provided such student completes a skill based vocational course of additional 4 credits having full marks 50 (Theory 30, Practical 20) for 8 (eight) weeks during the summer term (preferably from 3rd week of April to 2nd week of June) of the first year as a mandatory requirement. However, such additional credit will not be taken into consideration while computing SGPA/CGPA though it will be reflected in the Grade Card.

Such a student may take re-entry in 3rd semester within a maximum period of three academic years but not before one academic year from his/her exit. But from his/her exit but the entire programme shall be completed within the maximum period of seven years (in case of 4-Year Hons. Programme) and six years (in case of 3-Year Degree Programme) from original year of enrolment in Sem.-I Examination.

iii. If a student intends to exit the programme at the end of the 2nd year after securing 87 credits, such student will be awarded "UG Diploma", provided such student completes a skill based vocational course of additional 4 credits having full marks 50 (Theory 30, Practical 20) for 8 (eight) weeks during the summer term (preferably from 3rd week of April to 2nd week of June) of the

**second year as a mandatory requirement.** However, such additional credit will not be taken into consideration while computing SGPA/CGPA though it will be reflected in the Grade Card.

Such a student may take re-entry in 5th semester within a maximum period of three academic years but not before one academic year from his/her exit. But the entire programme shall be completed within the maximum period of seven years (in case of 4-Year Hons. Programme) and six years (in case of 3-Year Degree Programme) from original year of enrolment in Sem.-I Examination.

**iv. All students of 5th Semester shall have to undergo Internship/Apprenticeship in a firm, industry, college library, or organization or Training in labs under Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programmes or as to be prescribed by the competent authority from time to time. Students will be provided with opportunities for Internship with local industry, business organizations, health and allied areas, local governments (such as panchayats, municipalities), elected representatives of Parliament or Assembly, media organizations, artists, crafts persons, and a wide variety of organizations so that students may actively engage with the practical side of their learning and, as a by-product, further improve their employability.**

Modality of completion of Internship: Duration-4 weeks, [preferably September - December, (Full Marks -50; Theory-30, Practical-20)], certificate from the authority concerned, submission of report on the activities of internship to the college concerned, presentation & viva-voce conducted by the college.

**v. Students who wish to undergo a 3-year UG programme will be awarded UG Degree in the Major subject/discipline after successful completion of three years, securing 128 credits and satisfying the credit requirement.**

**vi. A four-year UG Honours Degree in the Major subject/discipline will be awarded to those who have completed a four-year degree programme with 178 credits and have satisfied the credit requirements.**

vii. Students who secure CGPA 7.5 and above at semester six and wish to undertake research at the undergraduate level can choose a research project/dissertation in the fourth year. They should do a Research Project or Dissertation under the guidance of a faculty member of the College. The research project/dissertation will be in the Major Subject/Discipline.

Necessary activities of such Research Project/Dissertation shall be initiated in the 7th semester and Seminar/Submission/Assessment etc. shall be done in 8th semester.

□ Students who secure 178 credits, including 12 credits from a Research Project/Dissertation, shall be awarded UG Degree (Honours with Research).

□ Honours students not undertaking Research Project/ Dissertation will do 3 Courses for 12 credits on his/her Major Subject/Discipline in lieu of a Research Project/ Dissertation. Such students who secure 178 credits shall be awarded UG Degree (Honours).

**To appear at Final Semester-end Examination (Semester - VIII), a candidate shall have to clear all previous Semesters (i.e., Semester I to Semester VII) in case of 4-Year Hons. Programme and to appear at Final Semester-end Examination (Semester - VI), a candidate shall have to clear all previous Semesters (i.e., Semester I to Semester V) in case of 3-Year Degree Programme.**

**Final Degree/Diploma/Certificate will be issued to the successful candidates at the Convocation.**

# Merit Index Score Calculation for UG Admission

## Eligibility Criteria for Merit Index Score Calculation:

- Students who have **passed Higher Secondary (10+2) or equivalent examination** from a **recognized council/board/university** in **2022 / 2023 / 2024 / 2025 / 2026** can participate in the college first semester admission process and will be admitted on the basis of the merit index scores and the tie-breaking rules wherever applicable.

## Merit Index Calculation of Honours & Program Courses for Different Subjects:

- For admission to the **4Yr Honours Programme** at the undergraduate level in the first semester, the **best four subjects with the highest marks in the Higher Secondary (10+2) or equivalent examination from any recognized board/council/university (each subject having full marks 100) will be considered for preparing the merit index score (i.e., aggregate marks in best 4 subjects)** and drawing the merit lists of all subjects.
- For admission to the **3-year Degree Programme** at Undergraduate level in the first semester, the **best four subjects with the highest marks in the Higher Secondary (10+2) or equivalent examination from any recognized board/council/university (each subject having full marks 100) will be considered for preparing the merit index score (i.e., aggregate marks in best 4 subjects)** and drawing the merit lists of all subjects.
- For laboratory-based subjects, separate passing in theory and practical is required, whereas, for subjects that are not laboratory-based, separate passing in theory and project is required.
- *The following tie-breaking rules shall be applicable, if multiple applicants have the same merit index score(s) in the subject-wise merit list drawn for the 4-Yr Honours as well as 3-year Degree level admission:*
  - STEP-I:** Higher Merit Index Score (best 4 subjects). If there is a tie, then STEP II will be followed.
  - STEP-II:** Higher aggregate marks in Higher Secondary (10+2) or equivalent examination (best 5 subjects). If there is still a tie, then STEP III will be followed.
  - STEP-III:** Higher aggregate marks in Madhyamik or equivalent examination. If there is still a tie, then STEP IV will be followed.
  - STEP-IV:** Earlier Date of Birth, with the older candidate to be given preference.
- An uniform list of Board / Council / University will be notified by the WBSCHE along with the notification for admission.

**“Marks” in a subject means percentage of marks secured in each subject mentioned at the 10+2 level Board/Council examination.**

### Library

Hooghly Mohsin College Central Library, previously it was Known as Hooghly College Library that was established in the year 1836 with 9275 donated books. At that time there was no record of library in the District of Hooghly. The then Principal James Alexander Wise took initiative to start a Library not only for its own students but for its neighbours also. Initially Hooghly College library was started with the grant from the Government and with donated books. Mr. Han was the first Librarian. Library started with grant Rs 400. Now its collection stands 1,14,800 books from Govt Grants. There are some rare books which may not be found anywhere in India but may be found in British Library London. This Library has two parts, One in the Bankim Bhavan and the other in Dwijendralal Bhavan. Books have been categorized in 18 subjects as follows.

# Message from the Anti-Ragging Committee Members

## What is Ragging?

As per the order of Supreme Court of India and subsequent Notification from University Grants Commission (UGC), ragging means the following:

1. Any disorderly conduct whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or a junior student.
2. Indulging in a rowdy or undisciplined activity which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in a fresher or a junior student.
3. Asking the students to do any act or perform something which such student will not do in the ordinary course and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of a fresher or a junior student.
4. Any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of other student or a fresher.
5. Exploiting services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or group of students.
6. Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students.
7. Any act of physical or mental abuse (including bullying and exclusion) targeted at another student (fresher or otherwise) on the ground of colour, race, religion, caste, ethnicity, gender (including transgender), sexual orientation, appearance, nationality, regional origins, linguistic identity, place of birth, place of residence or economic background

## Punishment to those found guilty

Any student or group of students found guilty of ragging in the campus or even outside the campus shall be liable to one or more of the following punishments:

1. Cancellation of admission.
2. Suspension from attending classes.
3. Withholding/withdrawing scholarships/fellowships and other benefits.
4. Debarring from appearing in any test/examination or other evaluation process.
5. Withholding result.
6. Debarring from representing in institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival etc.
7. Suspension/expulsion from hostel.
8. Rustication from the institution for a period ranging from one to four semesters.
9. Expulsion from the institution and campus debarring from admission to any other institution.
10. Fine ranging between Rs. 25,000 and Rs. 1,00,000.
11. Collective punishment: when the person committing the crime of ragging is not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment.

## ANTI-RAGGING COMMITTEE

Hooghly Mohsin College has an Anti-Ragging Committee, actively working under the Visakha Guidelines and the Anti-Ragging Act of 2005 as per UGC Guidelines, to prevent any form of ragging within the college campus, be it physical, psychological or even sexual.

• **The Anti-Ragging Committee keeps constant watch over the campus, in order to ensure the prevention of ragging. Our college maintains 'Zero Tolerance' to any of such incidents, if occur.**

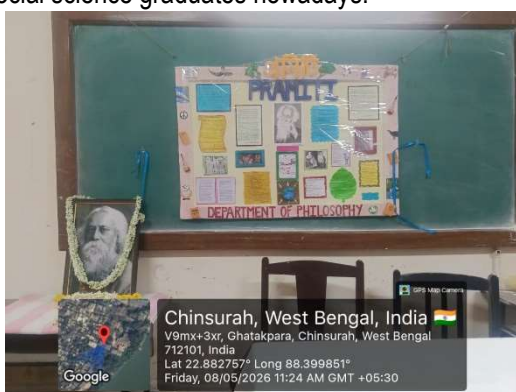

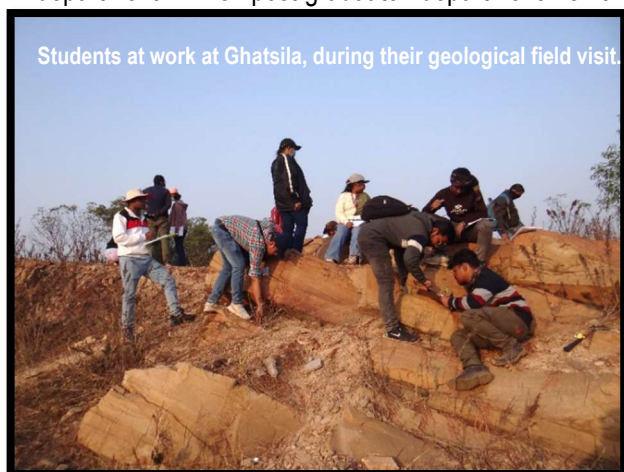
➤ **Physiology Department (UG & PG)**

➤ **Geology Department (UG & PG)**

The Department of Geology was established in 2010 as an undergraduate department and, thus, it is a relatively young department in Hooghly Mohsin College, the antiquity of which goes back to as early as 1836. The department currently runs both B.Sc. (4-Years Honours) and M.Sc. course in Geology. Beside classroom and laboratory teaching, field trips are arranged in fixed interval with students from different semesters of UG and PG batches. Students from our department also participates regularly in different inter-college, national and state level competitions and bring accolades for our department. This post-graduate department is the

Our alumni are currently serving as geologist under different departments of Govt. of India, Govt. of West Bengal, central PSUs as well as researchers in different universities and institutes.

Through career oriented, innovative and interdisciplinary learning, the department tries to impart knowledge of geology or earth science as a whole, so that the students can easily fit themselves in the job market. Mainly, students get absorbed in private exploration and mining companies, govt. PSUs and

research/scientific organisations like GSI, CGWB, SWID or Dir. of Mines & Minerals. There is also scope for research and career as an academican as the subject is taught in normal government colleges, as well as in IITs and IISERs.

### ➤ Chemistry Department (UG)

- The department of chemistry at Hooghly Mohsin College started its journey in the year 1907 and was upgraded into an honours department in 1948. At present the department trains the undergraduate students of chemistry (major and minor) in theory and practical curriculum following the syllabus of The University of Burdwan. The Department is enriched with eleven faculty members. It has three well equipped laboratories, an exclusive research laboratory, one instrument room and a comprehensive departmental library (1071 books). In order to promote holistic development of students, the department organizes seminars and encourages students to participate in seminars, quiz competitions, etc. at other institutions. Over the years the students of the department have fared excellently, pursuing their post-graduate and Ph.D courses in eminent national and international universities and institutes. The department is committed to teach and inspire students so that they become skilled and responsible chemists in future.
- The tradition of chemistry is rooted in centuries of scientific discovery, experiments and exploration of the world around us. In the modern world studying chemistry offers a wide range of career opportunities in industries such as pharmaceuticals, biotechnology, food processing, and environmental science. Students of chemistry can work as researchers, teachers, laboratory analysts or quality control officers in both government and private sectors.



### ➤ Physics Department (UG)

The Department of Physics at Hooghly Mohsin College, affiliated with the University of Burdwan, currently offers undergraduate courses aligned with the NEP 2020 framework, aiming to provide students with a solid foundation in both theoretical and experimental physics. An adequate team of highly qualified faculty members fosters academic excellence through regular classes, seminars, and workshops, guiding students toward research and career-oriented goals. The infrastructure is robust, featuring five well-equipped physics laboratories and a dedicated computer laboratory that enable students to gain essential practical knowledge and scientific skills in Physics.
